
Unto Gisela Triton, Roderick Opal, and the Atlantian College of Heralds,

Garfield av Kunningheim. Household name Rauðagalta hus.

"Submitted as Raudgoltr hus (which was intended as a gloss for Rauðgoltr hus), the name was intended to mean "red-boar house." Unfortunately, we have no evidence for a pattern of color+animal for household names in Old Norse.

There are two possible origins for such a name: an inn-sign name or a byname that combines the two elements. Inn-sign derived names will not come into use anywhere until after the end of the Old Norse period; we have no evidence that they were ever used in Scandinavia (though finding some would not be shocking). Therefore, such a model cannot be used to construct an Old Norse household name. Also, hrafnanna is the plural for "the ravens." No evidence was found during kingdom review for definite forms being used in farm names, though.

A possible suggestion for the house name was provided:

We have the pre-pended byname Gull-:

And we have the personal name Hrafn:



(The expected genitive would be Hrafn). That's get the submitter a name like Gull-Hrafn Hús or Gullhrafn Hús.

2. Sigunrðr inn Ógæfa - New Badge

(Fieldless) In pall two ravens rising respectant conjoined to the lip of a three-legged pot sable, all within and conjoined to an annulet Or.

This badge is linked with the submitted house name, so it must be returned as well.
